2009/10 Harry Butler Environmental Vocational Scholarship

Challenge

Undergraduate environmental science students looking for hands-on experience in managing fauna and flora biodiversity at a major hydrocarbon production plant are invited to apply for Chevron Australia's Harry Butler Environmental Vocational Scholarship.

The Scholar will work in a unique environment alongside highly experienced environmental specialists developing strategies and plans that govern Chevron Australia's operations on Barrow Island, a Class A Nature Reserve offshore north-west Australia.

Chevron Australia has had a close association with Barrow Island for more than 40 years where it operates an oilfield and plans to build a liquefied natural gas and domestic gas plant to process gas from the Greater Gorgon gas fields.

Understanding and managing biodiversity near these operations is vitally important to the company to ensure successful ongoing custodianship of the island.

Inspiration

Barrow Island, some 88 kilometres north of Onslow, is recognised as a reservoir of flora and fauna that was isolated from the mainland by rising sea levels about 8,000 years ago.

The Scholar will follow in the footsteps of world-renowned naturalist and former Australian of the Year, Dr. Harry Butler, who has played a leading role helping Chevron Australia successfully manage the unique biodiversity of Barrow Island.

Scholarship details

The Scholar will be employed by Chevron on a casual, paid work experience basis and the company will cover all operational costs.

The project will run for 12 weeks over summer, on a three-weeks-on one-week-off roster.
